The application will include a number of basic informational questions (i.e. contact information, educational experience, eligibility assessment). Provided below is a list of longer form questions that will be on the application.

Getting to Know You

- 1. Why are you interested in becoming a Perez Research Fellow?
- 2. What lived experience, skills, or work experience makes you a good candidate for the Fellowship?
- 3. Tell us about your experience in, and knowledge of Oakland and Alameda County.
- 4. What are your research interests? What areas of BRG's portfolio are you most interested in?
- 5. Read or listen to the first half of the article, <u>"Building Resilient Organizations" by</u> <u>Maurice Mitchell</u> (from start through the first five "common trends": Neoliberal Identity, Maximalism, Anti-Leadership Attitudes, Anti-Institutional Sentiment, and Cherry-Picking Arguments). In no more than two paragraphs, please answer the following questions:
 - Have you observed or experienced any of these common trends? In what ways do these common trends resonate with you?
 - What doesn't resonate with you? What feels challenging or uncomfortable?
